We purchased our property 24 Wollun Road Kentucky with the idea of retirement in the near future for peace and tranquility. Being also part of my superannuation, we have been told by our real estate agent to expect the property value to depreciate by as much as a third if the Thunderbolt Wind Farm goes ahead.

I have recently been diagnosed with menier's disease which have symptoms of vertigo, tinnitis & nausea, I have been told by a ENT specialist that infrasound associated with wind turbines can exacerbate these symptoms.

I have ongoing concerns about our area being a fire risk if the Thunderbolt Wind Farm becomes approved as there will be no access to aerial fire fighting due to the height of the 270m towers, this puts people lives at danger.
