One of the reasons why I and many others object to this proposed wind farm, indeed to all wind farms is this: In Rye Park Village and other such villages and rural areas there are no services such as town water, sewerage, kerb and guttering, garbage collection and in many cases the connecting roads are gravel. But we residents are more than happy to exchange all these for our quiet and peaceful lifestyle surrounded by beautiful untouched grass and bush covered hills . We enjoy the abundant bird and native animal wildlife and the lack of constant traffic.
