Inquiry backs residents over the incinerator

But proponents are 'very confident' it was proceed

THE community's fight against an incinerator at Eastern Creek appears to have been vindicated after a parliamentary inquiry recommended the project not go ahead.

Residents have called on Premier Gladys Berejiklian to reject the \$700 million proposal following the inquiry, despite proponents The Next Generation (TNG) remaining confident it will proceed.

"All the recommendations are in, all the science is in, and it's saying this is not safe," Melinda Wilson from community group No Incinerator for Western Sydney said.

In a report released last Wednesday, the Upper House inquiry shared resi-

dents' concerns about the plant's location close to homes and its potential emissions - it would burn more than 500,000 tones of waste per year.

The inquiry committee included members of the Labor, Liberal, Greens and Christian Democratic par-

ties. "The committee recommends that ... the NSW Government not approve the energy from waste facility proposed by The Next Generation at Eastern Creek," the report found.

The report also found that TNG did not come "within a bull's roar" of adequate community consultation, had "antagonised" residents and argued that the proponent had a "significant history" of non-compliance with environmental standards.

But a spokesman for TNG was not deterred, claiming the plant would address issues of "dwindling landfill and energy shortages".

"While we are disappointed with the inquiry's recommendation, we remain very confident," the spokesman said.

Health fears exposed at incinerator's public forum

"HOW did it come to this?" was the message repeated by residents during an emotion-charged public hearing into an incinerator proposed for Eastern Creek on Monday.

Residents vented their frustrations at Rooty Hill's Novotel Hotel over the drawn-out approval process for the plant, saying it had left them unable to sleep and fearful of the future.

"I do not want my children to die," mother-of-four and St Clair resident Julie Tsanadis told representatives of the Independent Planning Commission (IPC), which will rule on the proposal.

Fellow resident Lilli Barto said she was "disillusioned" by the state's planning process. "I cannot believe that this proposal has got to this point in the first place," she said.

More than 150 people attended the forum, which will assist the panel making a ruling on the proposal. A total of 28 people spoke, including Blacktown Mayor Stephen Bali, McMahon federal Labor MP Chris Bowen, Mulgoa state Liberal MP Tanya Davies and Mt Druitt state Labor MP Edmond Atalla.

Urbis' Clare Brown spoke on behalf of proponents The Next Generation. Ms Brown said the \$700 million plant posed "no human health risk" and would employ modern technology "that is being used in 35 countries".

Commission chair Robyn Kruk apologised to residents who had to leave work to attend the meeting: "We will endeavour to determine this development application as soon as possible."

Incinerator plans still up in air

But Blacktown mayor says Eastern Creek incinerator should still be refused on several grounds

IT'S been rubbished by the Department of Planning, NSW Health and the NSW EPA but the proponents of the Eastern Creek incinerator hope they might have been handed a lifeline. Dial A Dump Industries (DADI) chief executive Ian

Malouf welcomed comments from Federal Environment Minister Josh Frydenberg, who revealed on Friday "environmentally sustainable" incineration could be key to easing Australia's waste and energy problems. Mr Malouf said it was time the State Government followed suit "instead of worry-

ing about a few Nimbys ... spooked by a fear campaign filled with lies and hyperbole". "Mr Frydenberg has correctly pointed out there is no one solution to waste, but energy from waste is a key component in any policy to protect the environment, while also creating much

needed and low-cost electricity," he said.

Blacktown Mayor Stephen Bali accused Dial a Dump of being "delusional". He said its three unsuccessful attempts to prove the facility's worth showed "just how dangerous" it could be. "Today Dial a Dump dismissed the Department of

Planning and Environment, the Environment Protection Agency, the NSW Department of Health and Blacktown and Penrith councils as well as some 1000 community objectors as 'a few Nimbys'," Cr Bali said. The \$700 million proposal which would burn 500,000 tonnes of waste per year and

power 100,000 homes - has attracted fierce criticism.

The NSW Planning Department has ruled it should be refused on several grounds, including its "unknown" impact on air quality and human health.

The independent Planning Commission will have the final say in coming weeks.
