

To Penrith City Council and New South Wales Government,

Re: DA17/1092 – Wallacia Golf Course site, Proposed construction of cemetery, crematorium, function room, administration building, services outbuilding.

[REDACTED] it has been brought to the attention [REDACTED] that the above plans will negatively impact our school, its children and our ability to provide a safe learning environment.

Our concerns are:

- Traffic on our already busy main roads. Sections of both Mulgoa and Park Rd are compromised being flood zone areas and have both in recent years been flooded and unable to take traffic. Mulgoa and Park Rd have seen an influx of trucks in the past 3 months. Traffic reports attached to this proposal are already out of date and inaccurate. The influx of funeral traffic will make it harder for our children to get to school. Many of which walk or scooter to school. Crossing Park Rd is already a hazard and unsuccessful efforts have been made to put in a zebra crossing.
- Extra parking kerbside will again affect how our children get to school. Wallacia has many hills, and parking on the crest of hills will reduce visibility and make crossing roads harder. With such limited parking proposed within the cemetery development, it is conceivable that cemetery patrons would park their vehicles adjacent to the school and walk to the cemetery site. The kerbside parking outside the school is unlimited so this parking area may be occupied long term by patrons or workers while obstructing families from getting to and from school.
- [REDACTED] The report mentions public busses but as parents we are concerned that increased regular traffic and slower speed will mean that our children may miss connecting busses. Funeral processions are normally slower than regular traffic and could make our children late in

excess of 10 minutes. [REDACTED]

- The air quality will be reduced by the crematorium and increased traffic. Our Village is known for lingering pollution from bush fires and winter fires. It worries us that having a crematorium in this small area will worsen this to the point that our children with asthma and other breathing conditions will struggle. We don't want to see our children not able to go outside to play [REDACTED] This is completely unacceptable.
- While death is part of life, we feel having funeral processions and caskets [REDACTED] will affect our children's mental wellbeing. The impact this will have on our otherwise happy children will be massive [REDACTED]
