We are not here today just to discuss a club, golf course or where we bury people. We are here today to decide the fate of my home, my oasis, and the homes of many others.

I don't believe many of you including golfers have thought of this development in this way. At all and how it effects our free for every for the reason why I live in Wallacia like me most residents who brought homes here is due to the golf source.

Homes here is due to the golf course.

I brought my property specifically due to this. I had just moved off 500acres in Wallacia and couldn't bear to live with 3 colour bond fences and be boxed in.

my property come up for sale and the view down the 10th is superb. I have a pool style fencing like several of my neighbours for that reason my backyard is my everything escape from traffic noise, my entertaining area my sunroom with even better views it's my peace and serenity.

This lovely area will be ruined if we have to sit and watch several burials a day. I can't even been to think about its Traffic:

It's dangerous for the elderly and young-now to try and cross Park/Mulgoa road now

Mulgoa road can barely handle the traffic due to the development occurring up Silverdale and Warragamba let alone daily traffic to a cemetery.

Park road is no better how is there not going to be congestion with only a right hand turn lane for access from park road.

The suggestion from CMCT that there would be approx. 300 car movements a day is a joke the last funeral I went to at Pinegrove had 500 people that was, 1 funeral out of the whole day.

The traffic occurring already for the club and possibly in the future would not have the same effect as people accessing the cemetery as the clubs traffic is not concentrated as per a funeral.

Community:

The residents will lose a community facility that was always intended for their use and also have their properties devalued. The everyone doesn't want to touch out the lack of park, which is ridiculous who would want to cop a golf ball in the back of the head or have children playing/people walking dogs whilst your burying you loved one??

And who would want their children to play in a graveyard! I have also had some elderly residents saying it's just cruel to make us look at a graveyard all day. — didnt have here for that

Wallacia has approx. 600sq meters (that generous) of green space and with the airport down the road green space is a big deal.

We don't have any other sporting fields, no football, netball etc. except the golf course.

It was only a few months ago the premier said the area around the airport would be a leafy aerotropolis. What a joke with the removal of mature trees for burials.

The temperature of the area due to increase with the tarmac etc.

Zoned semi-rural 200,000 burials is not semi-rural! I cannot build a granny flat in my front yard or a garage door facing the road but how

we can bury over 200,000 in my backyard in flood zone this is beyond me.

I have building restrictions placed on my property by council, as do Kerry and Terry yet if you draw a line from our 2 properties the entire golf course is in-between.

How is it possible that both of us have flooding restrictions and their property is higher than the golf course but we can put bodies in it?

Additionally in 2009 Panthers tried to do the same thing but it was, considered unattainable as it was a flood zone.

Flood zones have not changed. I wonder if people at Richmond are aware that their drinking water supply will have some nice chemicals added to it if it goes ahead.

The same golfers don't care about Wallacia and what sort of Wallacia they leave behind for future generations and only really care about what golf they can play before they can't play anymore And also don't realise that the social golfers will not play here if it's not 18 holes and these are the people that help pay for the course.
