KRPA has been involved since the first discussions for about 18 years.

Little or no support for:

1 Creation of further accesses to beach.

2 For the creation of a surf club – as it is a Level 7 i.e. dangerous beach.

The placement of flags could be seen as indicating a safe swimming area which is not correct.

My local research has led me to believe that a surf club at this site will not be able to provide sufficient numbers to provide the services of a fully functioning surf club.

(Cudgen Headland currently provides surf life saving members to assist the SALT Surf Club as

the SALT is unable to gain sufficient numbers.)

3 No support for 4 stoneys. 13.6 m. ?

General acceptance of the current design by:

- 1 Supporting the improved road design at the eastern end of the Grand Parade.
- 2 Supporting the reduction of the population in the development.
- 3 Supporting the increase in car parking recognizing that there is never going to be enough.
- 4 Supporting the increase in the "greening" of the development, retaining the storm water drains and the protection of the vegetation on state land.
- 5 Supporting a "storage facility" for surf rescue equipment but not a surf club.
- 6 Support for the curved corners of the buildings.
- 7 Support the expected 3 storey height along the Tweed Coast. Perhaps the larger buildings

be required to have the fourth storey (if there is one) set back so as to appear to be only 3 storey. Perhaps roof top gardens to soften the structures.

8 We would also support some of the development set aside for low income housing e.g. only one or two bedrooms.
