To the Planning and Assessment Commission,

Having given papers to PAC panels regarding coal mining in the southern coalfields, and researched the planning decisions made by PAC for coal mining projects over time, I'd suggest that it is now even more necessary for the panel to make less pro-mining decisions than has been the case in the past.

Globally the rise of emissions, the acceleration of climate change connected with Australia's dig- it -up and-export- it economy is dangerous for everybody: a more informed and responsible approach has to be taken by agencies which are essentially responsible for dealing with 21st. century conditions.

It is quite extraordinary that both state and federal Australian governments are approving more exploration licences, new and old mines despite the Paris Agreement and now the IPCC report. There are also questions to be asked about the impact of coal mining on water resources, a major issue since there has already been significant damage done in the way this resource is used.
