1.	Offset planting of 27ha of Koala Food Trees is not clear and is unresolved. It must be secured through binding or legal arrangement before any construction commences.
2.	Entrance roads through Environmental Protection Zones must have underpasses before any construction commences. If ONLY fencing is installed without underpasses it will result in Koalas and wildlife being cut off from their natural corridor for many years.
3.	The Cudgen Paddock (golf course) should not be fenced off .It was always to be part of the wildlife corridor and fencing would stop the Koalas from access to their food trees. The fencing should be placed around urban areas that abut the golf course to allow koalas and other wildlife unimpeded access to it.
