Dear IPCN Commissioners,

In Response to the Commissions Statement on the 4 October relating to Rix's Creek South Continuation of Mining Project (SSD 6300), I would like to comment on the additional information from the Department of Planning, Industry & Environment.

The air quality impacts of this project have been updated to address acquisition of residences and properties at Camberwell Village.

This additional information reflects the previous Air Quality information that has been available since 2015. In fact, the new/ additional receptors are further away from the proposed SSD operation than receptors already included in the original Air Quality Assessment.

The SSD 6300 project has had enormous public support. 900+ supportive submissions were made via the IPCN Website.

An exhaustive and comprehensive review of the Project over many years has resulted in recommendations that the project "is in the public interest and is approvable, subject to strict conditions" from the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in May 2018 and June 2019.

I ask the IPCN to approve the Rix's Creek South Continuation of Mining Project (SSD 6300) without further delay.
