Inspection Purpose: The purpose of the site inspection was to understand the physical attributes of the site, key viewpoints and view the heritage context of the site and surrounds.

Summary: The Commission conducted an inspection of the site and surrounding area. The site inspection included:

- Viewing Macquarie Lane and potential impacts of an awning in this location.
- Viewing the hotel internally, including the Cortile Roof and the configuration for the proposed escalators.
- Viewing the site from the corner of Phillip and Bridge Streets, and the visibility of the proposal from Phillip Street.
- Viewing the site from the Botanic Gardens entrance to view the context of the proposal in relation to the Sir Stamford Hotel, Transport House and the Treasury Building.
- Viewing the site from Albert Street to view the northern elevation of the Intercontinental Hotel and how the building will sit between the pylons.
- Viewing the site from the Corner of albert and Phillip Streets.
