I strongly OBJECT to the DPHI's recommendation to re-instate 15 of the Turbines taken out.

It was clearly a good decision welcomed by our community and those that were to suffer from non-compliant Visual & Sound turbines.

The removal of these turbines also benefited the environment in particular endangered eco systems and water catchment areas of the Murray Darling Basement and Tamworth Regional water catchment area of Chaffey Dam.

The disturbance to soils, to our community village and roads is still unacceptable and my previous concerns and not been dealt with during this new submission process or since.

I don't believe it's good will or in NSW's best interest to overturn good Government policies for the benefit of ENGIE an international Company.
