I was shocked to hear DPHI wants to reinstate 15 of 17 turbines which were deemed noncompliant.

I am not against renewables, I am not against Wind Farms but I am absolutely against the construction of Engie's application for HOCWF in the proposed location as it requires further clearing of endangered species habitat. In particular Turbine 28 which requires 1.5 ha of deforesting native bushland that is home to koalas, Barking Owl and the Large eared Pied Bat.

Also of concern is the fact that the main land holder interest has set a dangerous precedent by unlawfully clearing areas of his land pre-empting the project approval and thereby avoiding some biodiversity costs.
