



It is NOT surprising that Neacher presentation although it also want over time did NOT include the word BUSHFIRE orce.

It is also disappointing that both community speakers in favour of the wind farm are not RFS, members.

BUT all are happy to take alrial support away from those who are.

I have included as Appendix I a copy of a page from the book 'Think Trees Grow trees showing the spread of a fire started at Hall in the A.C.T in 1979 showing its spread and Timing.

Take arrial support away from us and we are back 50 years.

Aircraft are also used to drop a retard and line to protect property or run a back burn off.

Aerial support is not just for fire fighting but crew protection. If things go pear shaped they can drop in on you to stop an over run. This can save a crews life.

I would recommed removing towers T26, T27 vT28 to allow helicopters access to the big Dam on Pine creek at Banalasta.

The removing of towers T23 T24 & T25 from a HIGH fire danger should be obvious.

Remember the decision you make has the potential to have the life of fire fighters in your Hands.

Sofar this year there has been adleast 2 wind tower fires in Australia taking around 6 trucks and about 20 VOLUNTEERS.


