## Shut down NSW native forestry and Victorian businesses close

Our company is Riverina Redgum Firewood Supplies and we have been operating for 34 years based out of Victoria.

It is a family business that retails firewood for quality heating.

We employ 3 full time and 4 part time staff members who live locally in with their families.

Our supplies come from the sustainable river redgum harvesting in NSW based around Since the closure of the native forest operations in Victoria we are totally reliant on sourcing from NSW.

We are a vital part of the supply chain that provides firewood from the residues of forest operations in NSW to the wood heater market which is very strong in Victoria.

As part of giving back to our community we provide sponsorships such as the local football club to encourage young players.

Our customers want a sustainable supply of timber and there are no redgum plantations that provide this resource. Redgum is a highly prized firewood because of its inherent properties.

I would recommend that you watch the short video made by Pivot Stove and Heating in Geelong on how to prevent emissions from the wood stoves and heaters which educates customers on the type of wood and how it must be prepared as well as heater maintenance.
