Topic 1. Sustainability of current and future forestry operations in NSW

It is my understanding that the future of the timber industry lies in plantation settings on marginal farmland. Native forest logging employs very few workers in comparison and runs at a huge loss to the taxpayer. Native forests are worth far more left standing.

State native forests have a huge potential to provide a range of positive social and recreational opportunities for the community.
