I strongly object to this proposal and the lack of community consultation that has taken place. The applicants representative have conceded that they cannot control the microplastics omitted from this site so why would you even consider subjecting our community to this. Where is the EPA. Let them come and explain to the residents that this is an acceptable risk. Not good enough. As a moss vale resident my first contact with GHD the applicants representative was via an unmarked blank envelope in my letterbox (supposedly a neighbor notification) advising that they proposed to direct their 120+ truck movements per day past my front door and through two school zones giving me 2 days to respond with any objections.

This is only one of many examples of the contempt our local community has been subjected to by GHD and the applicant.
