If this development goes ahead in Moss Vale, especially where it is proposed the risks that come with it endangers the lives of many people including children, that surely should show it is not the right site. With the amount of large trucks traversing through the nominated path 24/7 especially past a daycare centre endangers the lives of residents walking, riding, parents or grandparents dropping children off and pickup at daycare centre, and just the local residents driving from A to B.

The potential risks of micro partials of plastics floating in the air could potentially affect asthmatics, affect animals (this area is largely populated with horses, dairy cattle, Lamas etc) that eat the polluted source of food, and most important our water sources, to which this area is part of the Sydney water catchment.
