I object to the Plasrefine proposal in the Shire on the following grounds.

- 1 Too close to residential areas.
- 2 Too close to schools and childcare centres
- 3 Too close to the Garvan Institute the BioResources facility. Noise and vibrations may disrupt the mice breeding cycle from increased heavy vehicle traffic
- 4 Potential environmental impacts in the event of failure of the process
- 5 Removal of microbat habitat
- 6 Too close to the Wingecarribee River
- 7 Potential disturbance of platypus habitat
- 8 Direct and indirect impact on vegetation
- 9 Plastrefine is classed as heavy industry, not to be placed in sensitive areas
- 10 Our local fire services are very small, not capable of handling a major fire on site
- 11 Chemicals in plastic are potent environmental pollutants. How will the emissions be safely monitored
- 12 Any odours generated by the plant could be carried by the wind within our shire and beyond.
- 13 Property devaluation, potentially causing stress and mental health issues to those residents living close to the site, and beyond.
- 14 It is a basic human right to have access to a clean, healthy and sustainable environment.
- 15 Plastics can only be recycled 2-3 times, eventually ending up in landfill, after an increase in hazardous materials at each process.
- 16 More emphasis should be placed on reducing the amount of plastics original produced
- 17 There is no quarantee that mistakes will not be made, which could impact the health of our community.
