- 1. We are very concerned about the effects the production of resins will have on the local environment, the health of residents and their children There is no buffer zone to protect the adjoining homes or the towns and there will be toxic fumes emitted during the resin production
- 2 The site is proposed on the water course of the Wingecarribbee River which provides drinking water to Sydney via the Warragamba Dam. There is also a platypus colony at Berrima which could be effected if pollutants flowed into the river systems
- 3.Traffic --the huge increase in large trucks transporting used plastic in and product out of the Southern Highlands will cause chaos on the already stressed local roads and who will monitor that the drivers stay on the designated road. As the facility is to open 24/7 the traffic movements will be constant
- 4. The residents have been instructed to "STAY INDOORS" if it is windy to reduce their contact with emissions -- this surely is a warning that this is NOT the correct site for this facility

The prevailing wind in the Southern Highlands is SW and this will result in fumes being spread over not only Moss Vale but Berrima Burradoo and Bowral

- 5. Plastic recycling is a Heavy Industry not light industry that was intended for SHIP development and so should be well away from residential areas with a decent buffer zone. The proposal has been rejected by our council as not the right site --surely in a democratic country this should be taken into consideration.
- 6.Fire -- there is a very real threat of fire in a plastic recycling factory and the Southern Highland's have not the resources to fight a massive fire and imagine the toxic fumes and material that would escape into environment

Having listened to well qualified speakers at the meeting we really hope that sense prevails and the Plasrefine Development is rejected by the Independent Planning Commission --This is NOT THE RIGHT PLACE but we understand that there are more suitable area in the state which would welcome such a development
