I would like to object on several grounds, firstly the far reaching effects of the micro plastics toxins this plant will produce affecting our air, land, animal life and waterways (which also supply Sydney). Also expected is a degradation of air quality with odours from burning. Toxicity reports have been requested over the past four years & have not been forthcoming. This plant started as a small building which plans have now seen it grow to much larger dimensions including the vast stacks which were noticeably absent from early submissions. There has been an unprecedented lack of transparency on the part of the Applicant to answer ongoing questions from the Community. There is no buffer zone between residents whose homes literally back onto Plasrefine. The increased road traffic coming & going into this largest recycling plant in Australia will negatively impact the schools, homes & degrade roads. This industry will negatively impact "THE SHIP' for which the State Government has financed plans which have been produced. Businesses which would have gone into THE SHIP to support our area will stay away, tourism will also be negatively impacted and the quality of Southern Highlands life will never be the same if Plasrefine goes ahead in Moss Vale.
