My family and I have lived in Moss Vale for over two hundred years. Throsby was the founding pioneer and my family were the workers who helped to build the infrastructure and who farmed the land providing food and produce. As a resident of 69 years I have seen many changes that have benefited the town. However, should the proposed SSD-9409987 be built in Moss Vale it would ruin the fabric of the town and destroy the clean country air and water. I regret that if the proposal goes ahead, I would wish to move away from this village that has been the only home I have known.

As someone who has worked in heavy industry I understand the deleterious effects that hazardous industry would bring and its risk to human health. I have been researching the many current studies on PFAS contamination and I would not wish to live here in the changed conditions that Plasrefine would incur.

Along with the many inconsistencies within the GHD EIS I am concerned that the

Application No SSD-9409987 should not be located at 74-76 Beaconsfield Road, Moss Vale because there is no buffer zone and a large factory operating continuously processing hazardous chemicals should not be located close to an existing residential area. Transporting raw waste plastic from collections outside of the area where it has been generated does not make logistical sense, the factory would be better located closer to its source, not in a country area whose main industry is agricultural and within a water catchment.

The roads to and from the proposed site are inadequate, mainly residential and also at risk of traffic build up where train lines coincide, this is not conducive to heavy traffic industry.

At 37 to 39 Parkes Road Moss Vale a DA has been approved for an additional tender age day care facility, this is within walking distance of the hazardous industry being proposed and highly incongruous with the health of our young and developing children.

I completely object to the proposal by Plasrefine, it is the wrong industry for this town.
