This proposed development It is too close to residential areas. It is too close to schools and childcare centres. It will directly and negatively impact thousands of people! There will be substantial disruption with heavy vehicle traffic and reduced air quality. There will be plastic particles in our air, water & land! There is the potential for long term health issues for everyone, and it is very close to three of the largest schools on the area (Moss Vale Public School, Moss Vale High School and St Pauls Primary/International College) "a direct negative impact on the next generation.
