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We have purchased land and built a new home with a view to grow our own food as much as practical, while providing for our children a lifestyle that has more outdoor activity in a healthy environment. Now we have been told that a significant facility is planning to be built within a couple of kilometres from our new home that has potentially lethal side effects from micro plastic contamination due to ground water seepage and prevailing winds air dispersal. This causes us significant distress and threatens the value of our investment in a personal, social and financial manner.

Having worked in Disaster Recovery, I am shocked and appalled at the token responses to risk mitigation used by the proposed developers. Shelter in Place indoors is the least desirable of all disaster response options and yet it is offered as a day to day management strategy. We moved here so we could spend more time in the outdoors, now we're being told to stay indoors for our health? Furthermore how do we shelter in place our livestock and animals? The increased vet bills have the potential to be crippling. Ground water contamination would deteriorate the quality of our soil and continue to poison ours and our animals' bodies daily.

We have also had workers tell us that they will be parking many trucks on the private right of way to our property and ever our land (whether we want them to or not) once the facility is operating glibly informing us that we will be compensated. No amount of compensation would remedy that intrusion on our private lives.
