As a community member, a landholder with one hundred acres under my stewardship and a member of the local Land for Wildlife program, I object to the construction of a recycling facility that could adversely affect the whole Southern Highlands community. My husband and I, with the assistance of hundreds of Rotary and other volunteers, are regenerating our waterways and riparian zones by planting native species. Our aim is to create wildlife corridors for endangered species and pristine waterways for all creatures. The construction of this large built-up site would be an eyesore from vantage points throughout the Highlands, including the Gib, and provide an ongoing risk of contamination to our water ways with pollutants and microplastics. There is also a significant risk of air pollution from fumes, particularly if the site was to catch fire. I believe that the buildings on this site are higher than advertised because they sit on a base of six meters of fill. The project should be halted until all environmental and social issues can be assessed and abandoned if there is not 100 per cent certainty that the beautiful Southern Highlands environment will not be put at permanent risk of harm.
