The amount of heavy vehicle traffic would be detrimental to our roads as the highways surrounding the area would not cope with the amount of traffic. The recycling plant is very large indeed and with a 22 meter stack would be an eyesore to the pristine Southern Highland area. A great concern is also the fact that this project would be run by a and according to an ABC article published on MOnday the 28th of October had not passed ecological standards Why would you put such an operation anywhere close to a community in NSW let alone in the beautiful Southern Highlands? We believe the Wingecarribee Council was overridden in this process, a very worrying fact.

Toxicity risks, the closeness of this project to the township of Moss Vale and the surrounding properties, traffic noise caused by heavy vehicles and damage to our already fragile roads plus a 22 meter stack, and the scale of this project point to a very poor outcome

for Moss Vale and the Southern Highlands. We also believe that this project may operate for 24hours a a day, with series consequences for our area.
