I live in Murdoch St close to Military Road. As the density of population in our LGA has increased, so has the traffic density.

Parraween St is very narrow with parking on both sides and even now is very dangerous to both drive or try to cross the road.

Winnie St is clogged almost all day now and it is common to sit through three sets of lights at Military Rd to get through to Murdoch St. It is particularly bad at school drop off and pick up where wait times can be even longer.
